For beginners, writers who are stuck, or simply anyone who wants the experience of writing and getting feedback in a group, this workshop will offer the experience of writing with a "prompt." Participants also will learn how best to respond as a group to provide each writer with insights on his or her strengths, which sentences or words make the reader want to read more, and where the voice is strongest and most compelling.

How to Get Your Poetry Published

Whether you have yet to submit your first poem to a literary journal or are ready to offer a publisher a book-length manuscript, this mini version of a one-day Writer's Center workshop provides advice on how to succeed. Get tips on placing poems in print and online journals, why anthologies are such an appealing platform, how to publish chapbooks and books, the pros and cons of contests, the etiquette of poetry submission, how to develop your poetry network, and how to keep your morale high while facing rejection in a highly competitive field. A Q&A period will follow.

Teacher & Bio: Michele Wolf is the author of "Immersion," "Conversations During Sleep" (Anhinga Prize for Poetry), and "The Keeper of the Light," (Painted Bride Quarterly Poetry Chapbook Series award). In this hands-on workshop, students will concentrate on short stories—those things with beginnings, middles, and ends that delve into the human spirit and attempt to reveal to us who we are. We'll work on a couple of exercises that involve turning memory into fiction, and perhaps you'll come up with the ingredients for a story of your own.

This workshop is a fun arts activity in which participants are introduced to the field of book arts and are guided through the development of their own pop-up book.

She holds a Bachelors of Arts in Art with a concentration in Art History and a Masters in Business Administration. She has experience working with arts organizations such as the Cavallaro Cleary Visual Arts Foundation, The Art Institute and Gallery, and Maryland Summer Center for the Arts.

Whose Story?: Kids' Books by Teen Authors

11 am - Noon Ages 6+

Who can become a published author? Ask the teens of Reach Incorporated, who wrote and published their own original children's books with the help of Shout Mouse Press. Join us for a reading and discussion of their books and then put storytelling principles in action to brainstorm and pitch your own book.

Presenter & Bio: Kathy Crutcher is the founder of ShoutMouse Press, a nonprofit publishing house for unheard voices. She has been leading creative writing workshops for kids and teens in Greater Washington for the last five years and has published their original children's books, essays, and story collections. She received her MFA in Creative Writing from the University of Arizona. Kathy will be joined by teen authors from Reach Incorporated, a nonprofit organization that trains teens to teach younger students.

Implement BookTalks into Your School and Home

Noon – 12:30 pm All ages

A booktalk is a short, engaging and enthusiastic presentation that integrates reading, writing and speaking and is designed to inspire others to read the same book. Research indicates kids don't read as much as they might because of lack of access to recommendations, especially those from peers. During this workshop, parents and children will learn how to leverage booktalks at home and in the classroom.

Fiction Writing: Create Your Own Stories!

12:30 – 1:30 pm Ages 7+ Do you like writing fantasy? Realistic fiction? Or are dystopian worlds more your style? If you do, then this workshop is for you! Writers will be encouraged to create a piece of fiction through original Writopia creative writing games while getting stellar feedback from published authors trained in our method. At the end of the workshop, writers are encouraged to read their work and receive constructive feedback from fellow writers and instructors.

Presenters & Bios: Genna Kohlhardt is a Program Coordinator and instructor at Writopia Lab. Her poems have been published in Strange Machine, H_NGM_N, Fact-Simile, Jupiter 88 and The Anvil Lit Review. She received her MFA in poetry from Boise State University and in 2011 she founded Goodmorning Menagerie, a chapbook press dedicated to publishing works by poets.

Alex Henderson is a Writopia Lab instructor who came to Washington, DC from North Carolina, where he focused on creative writing and Russian at UNC-Chapel Hill. Now an MFA candidate in fiction at George Mason University in Fairfax, VA, Alex spends most of his time riding the Metro with his notebook balanced on his knees. His fiction has appeared in Harper Perennial's *Fifty Two Stories*, and Ekleksographia.

Creating a Character: Monologue, Dialogue

2:30 – 3:30 pm

Ages 8+

In this interactive workshop, students will use their imaginations to create an original character and write a monologue for him or her. Through games and activities, they will understand the importance of conflict in playwriting and work with a partner to create an imaginary conflict for their characters. They will then write a dialogue with their partner. At the end of the workshop, they will act out their monologues and dialogues for each other!

Presenter & Bio: Laurie Ascoli is the Program Manager at Young Playwrights' Theater and has worked in professional theatre as an arts educator and administrator for over six years. Before joining YPT, she worked as a young performer supervisor on the John F. Kennedy Center's productions of Ragtime and The Golden Age and taught for Roundhouse Theater and Imagination Stage. Laurie holds Bachelors degrees in Theatre, English, and Education.

My 1st Comic Cover

3:30 - 4:30 pm

Ages 7+

In this workshop participants will learn what makes an effective, dynamic comic book cover and get a brief understanding of the process of comic book inking and coloring. We'll see how an inker adds dimension to illustrations by defining the moods and setting of the penciler's drawing, and learn how colorists prepare layouts for print. Participants will be able to ink and color their own pre-drawn comic book sketch cover to take home.

Presenters & Bios: RAY, TIM and ROB are a team of highly trained and talented artists, writers, and creators putting their individual abilities together to create collective greatness! Art Way Alliance is an emerging organization that focuses on teaching young people in the DC region how to make art of their own choosing. By focusing on many forms of art, but concentrating on its more popular inceptions--i.e. cartooning, anime, comic books—the organization aims to help a new generation produce a culture that shapes society while appealing to their current interests.

College Admissions Essays: Writing Your Way into College

4:30 – 5:30 pm

Teens

In this workshop, Writopia instructors will help college-bound high schoolers identify unique and meaningful personal stories and tell them in their authentic voices. Instructors provide guidance on structure and editing and will help students explore themes, expand on ideas and create drafts.

Presenter & Bio: Khadijah Johnson is a college essay instructor at Writopia Lab. She is a native Washingtonian author who attended Duke Ellington School of the Arts. Khadijah earned her BA in English from the University of Maryland and MFA in Fiction from National University, San Diego. Khadijah is currently working on a Gilded Age novel set in Washington, D.C.


